(05) **LUDWIG** 25 Jun 1820 - 05 Aug 1880 (died in Kreuzlingen)

Dr med, studied philosophy + medicine,

emigrated to Switzerland in 1850, became director

of psychiatric asylum in Muensterlingen,

left Jewry in 1852 and founded private psychiatric

clinic "Bellevue" in Kreuzlingen in 1857

(existed until 1980)

married 24 Jul 1848

JEANETTE LANDAUER from Huerben

01 May 1825 - 23 Nov 1891

wife Babette nee Rosenheim

(died in Scherzingen = part of Muensterlingen)
parents = Raphael Landauer + wife Bertha (Pessel)

couple had 6 children (baptized Lutheran)

Ludwig Binswanger's son Robert (1850-1910) continued his father's ambitious initiative, and so did grandson Ludwig junior (1881-1966)

(06) OSWALD

08 Feb 1822 - 27 Dec 1910 (died in Augsburg) partner of "Jacob Binswanger & Co" in Augsburg married (1) in 1848

KAROLINE KAHN from Osterberg (also spelled COHEN)
19 Feb 1825 - 06 Dec 1868 (died in Augsburg)
parents = Samson Kahn + wife Sara
married (2) 06 May 1875 in Noerdlingen
RICKE OTTENHEIMER from Jebenhausen
04 Jun 1828 - 16 Apr 1890 (died in Augsburg)
parents = Salomon Ottenheimer +

Ricke was the widow of Nathan Singer in Oberdorf graves S 12/5 (Ricke) + S 28/2 (Oswald) at Augsburg Jewish Cemetery

Oswald had 10 children out of his first marriage, 2 of them were partners of "Jacob Binswanger & Co"

BERTHA HARBURGER from Altenstadt

10 Feb 1842 - 14 Mar 1934 (died in Richmond)

Bertha's family emigrated to North America in 1853

10 Dec 1824 - 01 Jun 1863 (died in Osterberg)

(08) **ISAAC**

manufacturer in Osterberg married ca 1854

MINA HANAUER from Osterberg

18 Apr 1828 - 19 Sep 1895 (died in Augsburg) parents = Samuel Hanauer + wife Julia nee Eckstein

their son **Gustav Binswanger** (later changed name to Gustav Byng) founded **"General Electric Company"** in London (England) toegther with **Hugo Hirst** from Altenstadt (Bavaria), born as Hugo Hirsch.

(09) SALOMON

(Solomon in USA)

20 Apr 1826 - 04 Feb 1858 (died in Missouri City) emigrated to North America and first settled as merchant in Richmond, Virginia, later in Missouri City. He was shot to death by customer Dr George C Tuley (surgeon during Civil War under Major General Bishop - died in 1878) when on Shabat he refused to open his store and sell liquor - in 1891 his body was transferred to Elmwood Cemetery in Kansas City

married before 1852 probably in Richmond, Virginia **ELISE (ELIZA) NN** from Wuerttemberg (Germany) since 1870 lived with BA Feineman's family founded Elise Binswanger Nursery in Kansas City ca 1833 - 27 Dec 1904 (died in Kansas City USA) she was buried in same grave as husband Solomon parents = ?

Dec 1852 Richmond, Virginia - Feb 1926 Kansas City married 12 Jan 1870 in Kansas City, Missouri USA **Benjamin Arnold Feineman** from Bavaria emigrated to North America in 1850 and became a prosperous liquor wholesaler in Kansas City and first president of Congregation B'nai Jehuda 22 Dec 1830 - 11 Nov 1912 (died in Kansas City) parents = ?

(b) Carrie (Caroline) Binswanger

lived in Kansas City by 1870 ca 1855 Richmond, Virginia - ca 1871-1879 unmarried - she probably died in Kansas City

(c) Ida Binswanger

31 Dec 1856 Missouri - 23 Aug 1898 Kansas City married (1) in 1880

came to USA in 1869 and settled
as liquor wholesaler in Kansas City

parents = David Goslin + wife Elizabeth
