Aim of the Course:
The aim of the Bachelor Degree course is to provide students with the skills to apply academic methods and insights and professional skills to act in the occupational fields within social work. By developing expertise, the ability to take action and social and ethical skills, the students acquire the means to be able to offer their services as skilled employees. They will enable individuals, groups or social care organisations to enter into an active relationship with their environment, exercise their rights, and identify and fulfil their needs and interests. Students will also need to be able to recognise the contradictions and limits of social work in practice and be able to initiate steps to innovation.
